

Sally: They're at home, baking cookies.



## Let's Party





Every year, throughout the  
world, people put on masks, have  
parades, and dance, all in the name of  
fun. And let's face it, who doesn't like to  
party? Two of the biggest parties are  
Mardi Gras, held annually in New  
Orleans, and the Venice Carnival.  
Let's **investigate**<sup>1</sup> the origins of these  
grand parties and how they are  
celebrated today.

It is thought that the annual  
celebrations began in old Europe and  
were originally **pagan**<sup>2</sup> **rituals**<sup>3</sup>.  
People blamed the cold and dark  
winter months on evil spirits.  
So, at the first sight of spring, everyone  
got together and held loud festivities to  
scare the spirits away. The spread of  
Christianity could not stop the  
celebrations. Instead, they were  
**incorporated**<sup>4</sup> into the calendar as a day  
of feasting so that they fell right

before the beginning of Lent, the period  
before Easter when Christians eat less  
food. Mardi Gras is actually French for  
"Fat Tuesday," and the word **carnival**<sup>5</sup>  
comes from the Latin for "farewell to  
meat."

Besides food, eye-catching  
masks and fantastic costumes are staples  
of Mardi Gras and the Venice Carnival as  
well. Traditionally, these **disguises**<sup>6</sup> were  
worn to break down class divisions and  
allow people to **roam**<sup>7</sup> the city  
unrecognized. Now, they are designed  
and worn mainly to impress.  
Some **revelers**<sup>8</sup> paint their bodies,  
others wear feathers on their heads, and  
some men even dress up as  
women. The Venice Carnival is by far  
the most stylish when it comes to  
costumes. There is a fine tradition of  
mask-making and elegant eighteenth-  
century **masquerade**<sup>9</sup> dress in the Italian  
city. Mardi Gras, on the other hand,  
is known for its **outrageous**<sup>10</sup>  
costumes, which partiers are not shy  
about taking off. So, if you like a great  
party, and who doesn't, don't miss  
Mardi Gras or the Venice Carnival.


